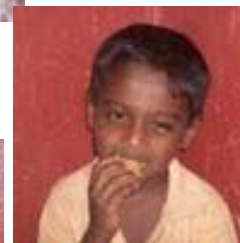

## Mission Statement

## Statement of Faith
