We, at LAF, have the distinct honor and privilege of knowing Pastor Rami* and his far reaching ministry to the lost of Chittagong Hill Tracts; a very remote region of Bangladesh. We don't often disclose just how we come to know those we support and/or minister to; but, suffice it to say, it can only be possible with God Himself. You see, a close friend of Pastor Rami's, who lives here in the U.S., had been lead by God to find and peruse the LAF website, and in turn contacted his friend, Pastor Rami. This is truly the intervention of our Lord Jesus. Pastor Rami, who was primarily educated in the Philippines, receiving a MS in Social Science, Master of Divinity in Theology, with extensive training in Discipleship, Leadership and Management, Pastoral Care and Counseling, Church Planting, and Cross-cultural Orientation, tremely remote Chittagong to name a few, is currently en- Hill Tracts of Bangladesh as

gaged in one of the most challenging evangelical and cultural areas in the world today. Pastor Rami's calling to reach the destitute people of one of the most remote regions of Bangladesh is undeniable. He affirms this by saying, "I committed myself to reach the people who have less or have never had the opportunity to hear the Gospel. The number of the Christian population in Bangladesh is the smallest in the world. This is due to many difficult circumstances evangelists and missionaries have to face. Therefore, I took this challenge to overcome those difficulties and hindrances. It is my commitment to reach them at any price and means."

Many already have made a profession of faith in the extry. His plan for the future is to plant at least twenty churches, setting up mission schools, children's homes, and expanding the ministry to all parts of the country. His well thought out and highly effective approach will result in thousands coming to know the Lord Jesus on a personal level. First he has an intensive ministry training program for evangelists who reside in these remote villages, thereby overcoming language and cultural barriers. These trained missionaries (15 to start) will take part in a "permanent witnessing group" program in order to gain trust, build relationships, offering continual support, and discipleship. Since nearly one hundred percent living in these isolated, inaccessible villages, are illiterate, they will be utilizing visual aids (i.e. Jesus Film, and other Biblical documentary films) to evangelize. Other ministerial programs that will be offered consist of: health care services, school programs, mobilizing and involving local churches, etc. In order for all to be accomplished, Pastor Rami needs our help; including our prayer support. Please diligently pray for Pastor Rami, his team, and the receptiveness of the people they come in contact with. Also, please follow God's leading if He impresses you to help support these 15 evangelists, so they can reach these other villages as soon. (cont. on pg.2)

I presented the Gospel and drove away the demon in the name of Jesus of Nazareth. The demon left her immediately and she could instantly respond to us. Earlier it was impossible for her to talk and she did not even look at us. God's miracle happened instantly after the prayer. Many people in the village were watching what we were doing. Both husband and wife accepted Christ on the spot. I asked them if we were allowed to destroy their gods (idols). They allowed us, so we removed from their house many hand made idols. Finally, I asked for scissors in order to remove their thread from their arms and around their necks. They were obedient, like a lamb, letting us do all this, ceremonially uttering the name of Jesus. Mission Work in Senegal

This Easter's youth ministry was very successful in Ziguinchor, Senegal. The program consisted of: hosting a soccer game, feeding the street children, and conducting extensive Bible studies. Both pastor and church planter. Pastor Moustapha; has done an incredible work for the Lord with his far reaching ministry to the people of urban and extremely remote areas of Senegal. Pastor Moustapha's method is simple; "we preach the Good News to the people. When they come to Christ and receive the Lord as their Savior and Lord, we teach them to know Him better and then make Him better known. Those who feel the Lord is calling them to the ministry are sent to the mission school for basic Bible training, then sent to the mission field. We are promoting the 'Great Commission' while organizing special meetings, talking about the urgency of the missionary work in our areas and in other parts of Africa". Pastor Moustapha grew up in a Moslem family, and losing his father at age six, became very distraught and frustrated throughout the early years of his life; as he put it, "despite all my Koran knowledge and its doctrine I learned, I was perplexed and hopeless". It wasn't until he attained college that he was exposed to Christianity. He rejected it violently at first, but found himself being drawn in by the Holy Spirit. After three years of college attendance, his relatives from Gambia coerced him into a bad business dealing, creating police involvement. Even though he was innocent of any wrong doing, he diligently prayed to the Lord to rescue him from the situation, and He did, miraculously. Shortly after that event, he had a dramatic encounter with the Lord in the form of dreams and visions, which he responded to by receiving Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior. That was in March of 1994. He has been serving Him ever since. The mission field in Senegal is wide open with only a 4% Christian population and 95% Moslem and a present government in place favorable to the open expression of all faiths. Please pray for this wonderful ministry work.

From the Director: LIFE Aid Foundation is on the verge of a major transitional phase in the ministry. We are at the very threshold of an extraordinary funding breakthrough. has submitted numerous proposals, and congrant tracted with a very large Christian nonprofit funding organization that is willing to fund a large portion of our ministry projects, both here in the U.S. and overseas. These proposed projects include building children's homes, churches, schools, medical facilities, and youth centers around the world. We will still be in need of your support in the areas of: reyouth programs, camp treats, and Bible classes, in the U. S.; also indigenous missionary support, child

sponsorship, educational sup-Bible distribution. port, transportation assistance, food distribution, pure waemergency relief projects overseas. pray that we will receive the promised funding very soon. We have cur-(when rently appropriately funded) filled four of our nine top level positions and a few of our lesser positions. God's timing is always

perfect. We are patiently awaiting for the total fulfillment of God's provision and grace.
